

The Literacy and Numeracy Catch Up Funding 2016-7 Review

The literacy and numeracy catch-up premium gives schools additional funding to support Year 7 pupils who did not achieve the expected standard in reading or maths at the end of Key Stage 2.

In 2016-7, Rastrick was allocated £14,500 for the catch up funding.

The school used the funding to support the following strategies:

- Small teaching group resources- £2000
- Accelerated reader programme-£1000
- Sixth Form reading mentor training- £2000
- Mathematics licence- £3000
- Reading for pleasure resources- £2000
- Stem Club resources aimed at practical Maths and Science- £2000
- Mentoring programme for pupils to train as mentors for pupils who are not making progress - £1000
- Literacy and theatre schemes -£1500
- Additional rewards for progress in literacy and numeracy £1000

The allocation of any additional funding will be allocated to react to needs during the academic year.

The impact of the strategies are summarised below:

100% of all pupils in English met the required standard.

100% of all pupils in Maths met the required standard.

46% of all pupils are now working at the expected level of a pupil who entered on or above the national benchmarks in English and Maths.

The 2017-8 Literacy and Numeracy catch up funding allocation for Rastrick High School is £12650.

The school will use the funding to support the following strategies:

- Accelerated reader programme £1,000
- Learning Hub £10,000
- Mathematics licence £1000
- Reading for pleasure £650

The allocation of any additional funding will be allocated to react to needs during the academic year.
